MAHAD BUILDING COLLAPSE

TOLL RISES TO 13

4-YEAR-OLD DEFEATS DEATH MIRACULOUSLY

The toll in Monday's collapse of a five-storey building at Mahad in Raigad district rose to 13 on Tuesday...

Till Tuesday evening, as many as 13 bodies had been recovered by the rescue and relief teams...

have so far died, while 78 others have been rescued so far. The rescuers are using special camera and dogs to locate the people still trapped under the debris.

In a related development, the Mahad police have registered an FIR against the builder as well as the contractor, engineer, architect and the building consultant.

Meanwhile, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said he was "saddened" by the building crash and assured that local authorities and NDRF teams at the site are providing all possible assistance to the victims.

Meanwhile, Maharashtra Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray and Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar have been taking stock of the situation through briefing that they are receiving from Raigad district collector Nidhi Chaudhari and superintendent of police Anil Paraskar.

Minister Eknath Shinde and Minister of State for Industries and Protocol Aditi Patkar visited the site to supervise the rescue operations.

Major fire at Kerala Secretariat, many sensitive documents, records destroyed

The day after the CPI(M)-led LDF Government defeated the no-confidence motion moved by the Opposition Congress in the House, the Kerala Secretariat saw a fire mishap in the evening which ravaged the Protocol Section of the Government.

The Fire Brigade that rushed to the site succeeded in bringing the fire under control but not before the Opposition BJP and the Congress alleged that it was a sabotage.

"The Protocol Department itself was under the scanner as it housed important documents exchanged between Minister of Higher Education KT Jaleel and the UAE Consulate in the capital city. There is no doubt that this is a pre-planned act of sabotage perpetrated with the knowledge of the Chief Minister," said K Surendran, State BJP chief who rushed to the mishap spot on hearing the news.

B Sunit Kumar, Protocol Officer, said no important files have been destroyed in the major fire. But Kumar also disclosed that he was not at the site of the fire as he was under quarantine. "But no important documents have been lost. The images which you saw in TV screens are those of extra copies of Government notifications that were stored in the section. But no important documents have been lost," Kumar said.

BIHAR ELECTIONS Nitish to launch JD(U) digital platform; hold virtual rally on Sept 6

Patna: In a bid to reach out to people across Bihar during upcoming polls amid Covid-19 pandemic, ruling Janata Dal (United) has created a digital platform on which Chief Minister Nitish Kumar will kick off election campaign with a virtual rally on September 6, party sources said on Tuesday.

Kumar, who is JD(U)'s national president, will formally inaugurate the digital platform "Jdive.com" soon so that it could be used for the virtual rally, its national secretary Ravindra Prasad Singh said in a statement here.

"Party chief and CM Nitish Kumar will hold Jan Samvad during which he will address partys first ever virtual rally using the digital platform on September 6," Singh said, claiming it would be country's first dedicated virtual rally platform where lakhs of people could be connected. Polls in Bihar are expected in October-November. Considering prevalence of coronavirus cases in the state, the ruling party like its BJP ally is bracing to use technology for connecting with the people during election, JD(U)'s platform has the capacity to link 10 lakh people, who could watch rally live besides connecting directly with it, he said.

Apart from streaming the public rally live on Jdive.com, it will also be broadcast on other social media platforms like facebook, twitter, Youtube besides live coverage of the programme by the news channels, he added.

The Election Commission had on August 21 issued guidelines for holding elections during Covid-19 pandemic. The guidelines put several curbs on organising campaign, voting as well as counting process.

Mamata letter to PM: Defer JEE/NEET in larger interest

In an apparent bid to hammer home the urgent implications of the matter Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Tuesday wrote a second letter to Prime Minister Narendra Modi requesting him to postpone the JEE and NEET exams scheduled to start in the first week of September 'in the larger interest of the student community' during pandemic period.

Saying that her Government had received a letter to this effect from the National Testing Agency to begin preparations for conducting the examinations which are gateways for aspiring engineers and doctors Banerjee wrote "I am aware that the Honble Supreme Court has given a verdict on holding JEE/NEET examinations and the Central Government has been issuing instructions to go ahead with it accordingly. However, I would like to request for your kind intervention and to consider the Central government making an appeal to the Honble Apex Court to review its decision in the interest of the student community, so that they are free from mental agony and mental disaster".

This was the second letter in two consecutive days with the first one being written on Monday requesting the Prime Minister to defer the exams. Saying that the students were in great agony she wrote, "such intervention is very much essential in the larger interest of the students to facilitate creating a situation whereby the students will neither be subjected to grave health risk nor they will be facing a career risk".

Day after winning confidence, CPM Govt suffers 2 setbacks in Kerala HC

The CPI(M) led Kerala Government suffered two major setbacks in the Kerala High Court on Tuesday, a day after it defeated the no-confidence motion moved by the Opposition in the Legislative Assembly. A Division Bench consisting of Chief Justice S Manikumar and Judge CJ Ravikumar dismissed the appeal filed by the Kerala Government challenging a single bench order

handing over the probe of the double murder case of two district level Congress leaders in Kasaragod district to the CBI.

Later in the day another single bench of the court dismissed the petition filed by the Kerala Government seeking a stay on the Centres order awarding the operation, development and management of the Thiruvananthapuram Airport to the Adani Group. The court however told the petitioner that they could sub-

mit before the bench hearing the case all relevant details regarding the bidding process.

Though a judge hearing the petition moved by the parents of the deceased had issued an order on September 2019 asking the CBI to probe the double murder of Kripesh and Sant Lal, who were murdered by a group of CPI(M) leaders on February 17, 2019, the Kerala Government challenged the said order in its appeal. The case caught national attention when the CPI(M)

filed a former attorney general who was paid more than a crore rupee to argue the case.

Though the hearing was completed on November 19, 2019 and the judges reserved the case for order, there was no action since then. Parents of the victims approached the Kerala High Court on Monday with a plea to transfer the case to another bench as the bench which heard the appeal had failed to pronounce the verdict even after six months.

94 Covid cases, including two civil judges, in Aligarh

The number of corona-infected patients is steadily increasing. On Tuesday, 94 new patients, including two civil judges, of the Junior Division, were found. Thirty-seven patients were discharged from hospitals and home isolation on recovery.

The number of active patients has increased to 1,080. A total of 2,364 patients have become healthy so far. 29 patients have died. A total of 3,473 people have been affected so far. The DM and CMO have appealed to the people to follow the law of masks and physical distance. DM Chandrabhushan Singh inspected 1-2 Covid Hospital at Deendayal Hospital on Tuesday and reviewed the arrangements.

Death toll, number of +ve cases increase in TN

Uncertainty continued to be the hallmark viz-a-viz coronavirus in Tamil Nadu as the number of new patients and the fatalities continued to be on the higher side on Tuesday.

The day saw 5,951 new persons getting diagnosed with Covid-19 in the State with Chennai alone accounting for 1,270 cases. The last 24 hours saw 107 patients succumbing to the pandemic and this took the total fatalities till date to 6,721.

Death toll during the last three days read, 80, 97 and 97 and this shot up to 107 on Tuesday. As on Tuesday, there were 52,128 active Covid-19 patients in the State.

The three districts which constitute the Chennai cluster

tested more number of Covid-19 cases on Tuesday.

Chengalpattu (321), Kancheepuram (214) and Thiruvallur (305) districts remained with higher numbers of patients while Coimbatore (322) and Cuddalore (370) showed no sign of any abatement.

There were 13 other districts which tested more than 100 positive cases on the day which belied the expectations that overall picture in Tamil Nadu is showing improvement.

According to Department of Health officials, Government is beefing up security and safety measures in the districts of Salem, Coimbatore and Cuddalore which were registering unusual hike in number of Covid-19 cases.

Patna HC creates record by disposing of over 26K cases through virtual mode

Bihar Deputy Chief Minister Dushahi Kumar Modi on Tuesday said the Patna High Court has created a record in the country by disposing of more than 26,000 cases through virtual mode during coronavirus pandemic.

While addressing a virtual meeting of BTPs legal cell, Modi expressed hope that the courts will soon start functioning through physical appearance. With a view to ensuring quick disposal of cases relating to the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012 (POCSO), one court has been constituted in every districts where less than 300 are pending, he said.

Likewise, 74 courts have been constituted in different districts in addition to the one already existing in every district for trying cases of Bihar Prohibition and Excise Act, 2016, Modi said.

He added a special court has also been constituted in all the districts to try cases lodged under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

AFSPA EXTENDED FOR SIX MONTHS IN ASSAM

Guwahati: The Assam Government said it has extended the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act, 1958 (AFSPA) in the State for six more months with effect from August 28. The State has been declared a "disturbed area" on account of recent insurgent attacks on security forces in the Northeast and scores of illegal arms and ammunition from different areas of Assam, a statement said.

TALKS ON SOLVE BORDER ROW WITH ASSAM

Shillong: The United Democratic Party (UDP) and Hill State Peoples Democratic Party (HSPDP) supporting the Meghalaya Democratic Alliance Government have demanded resumption of chief ministerial-level talks with Assam to solve the border issue with the neighbouring State. A delegation of the two parties called on Meghalaya CM Conrad Sangma and told him for resumption of talks to solve the border problem.
